
Often does not meet statutory requirements for intervention

- Provided follow-up

Victim of **Romance Scam**

- Screened out of APS due to victim having capacity • Relationship with FJC for referrals

Guilford County Family Justice Center One Safe Place: Many Partners, United Mission

- Reached out to victim to see if she was interested in discussing the possibility of her current relationship being a scam
- Provided emotional support and safety planning
