


- File a dispute (also called a "chargeback") with your credit or debit card company.
  - Online: Log onto your credit or debit card company's website and go through the company's dispute process.
  - By phone: Call the phone number on the back of your card and tell them why you're filing a dispute.



Download a call-blocking app.

- Some apps are free, but others charge a monthly fee.
- Some apps will access your contacts.
- Calls might be stopped,
   ring silently, or go straight to voicemail.

### How to stop unwanted calls

## ON YOUR HOME PHONE



See what **call-blocking** and **call-labeling services** your **carrier** offers.



Is your carrier an **internet** or **VoIP** provider? Look into **internet-based call-blocking** and **call-labeling services**.



Have a traditional landline that doesn't use the internet?
Install a call-blocking and call-labeling device.
(Not sure? Ask your carrier.)



Some services are **free**, but others charge a monthly **fee**.



With blocking services, calls might be **stopped**, **ring silently**, or go straight to **voicemail**.

# **ROBOCALLS**

If you answer the phone and hear a recorded message instead of a live person, it's a robocall.

Companies
need your
written
permission to
use robocalls
to sell things
to you.

### Why you're getting so many robocalls:

Often, it's scammers. The internet makes it cheap and easy for them to call from anywhere in the world.

### What you can do about them:

- 1. Hang up. If you press any numbers, you might get even more calls.
- 2. Use call blocking. Talk to your phone carrier and read expert reviews about your options.
